



## ARTIST GUIDELINES AND ACCEPTED WORKS

Please review these guidelines as they contain important information for those wishing to show their work at YAA.

### ACCEPTED GENRES:

The York Art Association is a visual arts organization with a focus on non-functional fine art.

Genres of work accepted for display in the galleries include:

- DRAWING – ALL MEDIA
- FIBER ARTS
- HAND PULLED PRINTS
- MIXED MEDIA /COLLAGE
- PAINTING – ALL MEDIA
- PHOTOGRAPHY/DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY – ORIGINAL IMAGES ONLY
- SCULPTURE

*\*Size, framing, hanging devices and sculpture display policies apply \*Exceptions may be made for special invitational exhibits.*

### REQUIREMENTS FOR ACCEPTANCE:

- No early intake.
- Works must be hand delivered to the premises and be signed in.
- Work must be completed in the past 3 years and is representative of artist's current or emerging artistic style.
- Works may be shown once in 3 years in the Nancy Woodward Gallery.
- All works (excluding sculpture) must be wired with gallery wire (twisted or braided, not single strand) for hanging. Saw tooth hangers, string or single thickness wire are not permitted.
- Paintings must be framed or have gallery wrapped canvas edges painted.
- Unless otherwise noted, size limitations are 48"x 60", including the frame. Diptych or triptych works must be displayed in a single frame to be considered one piece.
- Pick up dates are *usually* one-half hour after the close of the exhibit, and the following day and must be picked up by the artist or their representative. Please note: any work that is not retrieved by the last pick-up day is not covered by YAA insurance and may be disposed of without reimbursement to the artist. All efforts to contact the artist by phone and email will be made.
- The Rottler Award Selection Exhibit and the Rottler Winners Exhibition will alternate each year. A selection year will be followed by the exhibition of the winners the next year. Winners will not be eligible to enter again for the following 2 selection years.
- Exceptions to these guidelines may be made at the discretion of the Gallery Committee.

**PROFESSIONAL VS. NON-PROFESSIONAL:** *(Some of our exhibits require entrance with these distinctions. In those circumstances, please refer to the following guidelines to determine which category you should enter.)*

PROFESSIONAL designation meets any of the following criteria:

- Artists who regularly sell and exhibit their work
- Artists who have won any award in three exhibitions (honorable mention does not count)
- Artists who provide classroom instruction in the fine arts.
- Artists who holds a degree in the fine arts.

NON-PROFESSIONAL: New members who do not meet any of the above criteria for the professional designation may choose the category in which they would like to exhibit. If their status changes to meet any of these criteria they must use the Professional designation.
